About Us

Aurora Orchard Manor offers a supportive living and learning environment for young adults with severe and profound learning difficulties and complex health needs. With specialist facilities and a focus on promoting independence, we support each of our young people through the transition from education into adulthood.

Aurora Orchard Manor is situated in the village of Meldreth, on the border of Cambridgeshire and Hertfordshire. As a CQC 'Outstanding' registered care home, we offer flexible 52-week residential placements for up to 31 young people.

Our rooms are large and wheelchair-accessible and can be equipped with assistive technology where required. All the living areas have a kitchen where people are encouraged to get involved in choosing and preparing meals and a large lounge area where residents can relax and socialise with their house-mates.

Our facilities include:

- Adapted kitchen
- Sensory room
- Hard and soft outdoor space
- Hydrotherapy pool
- Rebound therapy
- Integrated therapy
- Extensive grounds



Our on-site Skills Centre is open to all our residents. The centre not only provides a space for learning and development – it is also a place where our young people can have fun, make friends and express themselves.

We also have good connections with the surrounding community and our residents enjoy regular off-site activities, such as swimming, sailing, shopping and visits to the library, cinema, local pub and even the occasional McDonalds!

Your experience with us

Every young adult has the opportunity to try new experiences when they arrive at Aurora Orchard Manor. We offer a variety of activities through our Skills programme, including cooking, music, art, sensory, ICT and community activities such as shopping, swimming and social enterprise.

Once a resident has had time to try out a range of activities, we hold a meeting with them along with their tutors, therapist, family and external professionals, to agree long, medium and short-term aims and targets based on their aspirations and goals and to develop an individual timetable that includes a variety of activities from our Skills programme.



Young people at Aurora Orchard Manor have the opportunity to learn work-related skills, develop their confidence and improve their communication skills by taking part in a range of fun social enterprise activities – past ventures have included making and selling soap, dog biscuits, cards, wrapping paper and chutney.

When a young person is ready to move on from us, they are supported to visit other places and explore the opportunities that are available. Our team supports both them and the staff at their new home to understand their needs and challenges and to facilitate the transition.


