

About Us

Aurora Meldreth Manor supports children and young people aged 6-19 with highly complex learning difficulties associated with conditions such as cerebral palsy, acquired brain injury, degenerative conditions or autism spectrum conditions requiring a specialist approach.

We offer day placements and flexible residential placements for up to 52 weeks of the year.

The support we provide enables each of our children to engage and progress at their own level within a living and learning environment designed to help them achieve their full potential as they reach adulthood.

Our curriculum and facilities

Aurora Meldreth Manor is situated on a beautiful 14-acre site in the village of Meldreth, on the border of Cambridgeshire and Hertfordshire.

The school and residential service is fully accessible with hoisting facilities available throughout, and offers a range of modern, creative spaces for living and learning.

Facilities include:

- Interior-designed living areas
- Multi-use activity area
- Hydrotherapy pool
- Rebound therapy
- Musical gardens
- Outdoor learning space and Forest school
- Multi-sensory areas
- Individual learning areas for break-out time and quiet time





A comprehensive specialist therapy team supports children at Aurora Meldreth Manor in line with each child's EHCP requirements, including through integrated physiotherapy, speech and language therapy, occupational therapy and music therapy. Nursing support is also a valued part of our provision.

Learning at Aurora Meldreth Manor is focused on preparation for adulthood. Our child-led curriculum incorporates functional skills for independence and self-advocacy, so that every child is able to access and be accepted by their community. Children have the opportunity to work towards formal qualifications that bring challenge and achievement to their education experience.

Our specialist teaching team works collaboratively with therapists and teaching assistants to develop and deliver a meaningful, appropriate and personalised curriculum for every child.

Our small classes are configured around diagnosis, communication needs, cognition and age appropriateness, with each class having distinctive characteristics according to the unique needs of its members.





Residential Facilities

As a registered children's home, Aurora Meldreth Manor provides flexible, accessible accommodation and a vibrant yet homely space in which to live.

Our flats each have a spacious living/dining room with TV, games and eating areas, and individual bedrooms with a mix of bathing facilities and hoisting throughout for safe and easy movement for those with physical conditions. For those that can eat orally, fresh food is prepared daily by our chef and a variety of tastes and diets are catered for.

Our residential care team is passionate about ensuring that every individual is happy, healthy and well-supported. Alongside delivering personal care and helping with the management of epilepsy and other conditions, our staff support our residents to develop friendships, explore new interests and take advantage of after-school and social activities.

We encourage families to visit regularly and are able to offer limited family accommodation.
