Aurora Ryefields School is a specialist school in Derby dedicated to providing exceptional education and support for children and young people aged 5-19 with Autism Spectrum Condition (ASC) or additional social, emotional, and mental health needs.

We cater to a wide range of needs across the ASC spectrum, including students with co-occurring conditions such as sensory processing difficulties and mild learning disabilities. Our mission is to empower students to develop skills, confidence, and independence, preparing them for fulfilling lives and active participation in their communities.

At Ryefields School, we believe every student deserves a personalised education that nurtures their potential and ensures success in the future. We are committed to creating a calm, structured learning environment that reduces anxiety and encourages positive behaviour.

Our facilities

Ryefields School is located on Parker Street, Derby, offering a specialist academic environment for ASC students with SEMH needs.

Ryefields School provides a safe, structured, and engaging environment with:

- Modern, well-equipped classrooms with sensory-friendly features.
- Specialist learning areas, including science labs, creative arts studios, and vocational training spaces.
- Calming breakout spaces and therapy rooms to support emotional regulation.
- Outdoor areas for recreation and structured learning activities.

About the Local Area

- **Transport Links:** The school is easily accessible, with Derby Train Station just a short distance away and several bus routes serving the area.
- **Community and Facilities:** Derby City Centre is within walking distance, providing access to libraries, museums, and cultural centres, such as the Derby Museum and Art Gallery and QUAD Derby.
- **Green Spaces:** Students benefit from nearby parks such as Markeaton Park and Darley Park, offering outdoor learning and recreational opportunities.
- **Support Services:** The area has a range of specialist services, including educational support centres, mental health services, and autism-friendly spaces, ensuring students receive well-rounded care.



Our curriculum

Our curriculum is designed to provide a well-rounded education while addressing the unique challenges faced by ASC students with SEMH needs. We offer a broad and balanced curriculum with a flexible timetable designed around each student to recognise individual abilities, interests and needs. Each student follows a personalised learning plan designed to meet their specific educational and emotional needs.

We offer:

- **Core Academic Subjects:** English, mathematics, science, humanities, and computing.
- **Creative and Vocational Learning:** Art, music, design technology, and vocational pathways.
- **Social and Emotional Development:** Personalised therapeutic interventions, including Speech and Language Therapy, Occupational Therapy, and Emotional Literacy Support.
- **Life Skills and Independence:** Preparing students for real-world challenges through practical skill development.
- **Physical and Outdoor Education:** Sports, outdoor learning experiences, and well-being activities.

Every student is supported by a dedicated tutor and teaching assistant who provides consistent guidance, encouragement, and communication with families throughout the school day. Our Student Support Plans (SSPs) help individuals develop positive self-regulation techniques and coping strategies, ensuring a successful learning experience for all.

We focus on empowering students to understand their diagnosis, build resilience, and manage anxiety. This is achieved through collaboration with our Clinical Psychology team, who work closely with students and their families to nurture their strengths and aspirations.

Our therapeutic provision includes Speech and Language Therapy and Occupational Therapy, delivered through an integrated approach where clinical and educational staff work together to provide holistic, student-centered support.

We are committed to equipping our students with the skills and qualifications necessary for their future. We support transition into:

- Further education and college placements.
- Apprenticeships and vocational training.
- Supported employment and work experience opportunities.

Our careers program follows the Gatsby Benchmarks, ensuring high-quality careers education and guidance.

Therapeutic Support

Our dedicated pastoral and specialist support teams work closely with students to promote positive mental health and emotional well-being.

We implement:

- The Zones of Regulation framework to help students understand and manage their emotions.
- Structured routines and visual supports to provide consistency and clarity.
- Targeted intervention programs for speech, language, and communication needs.

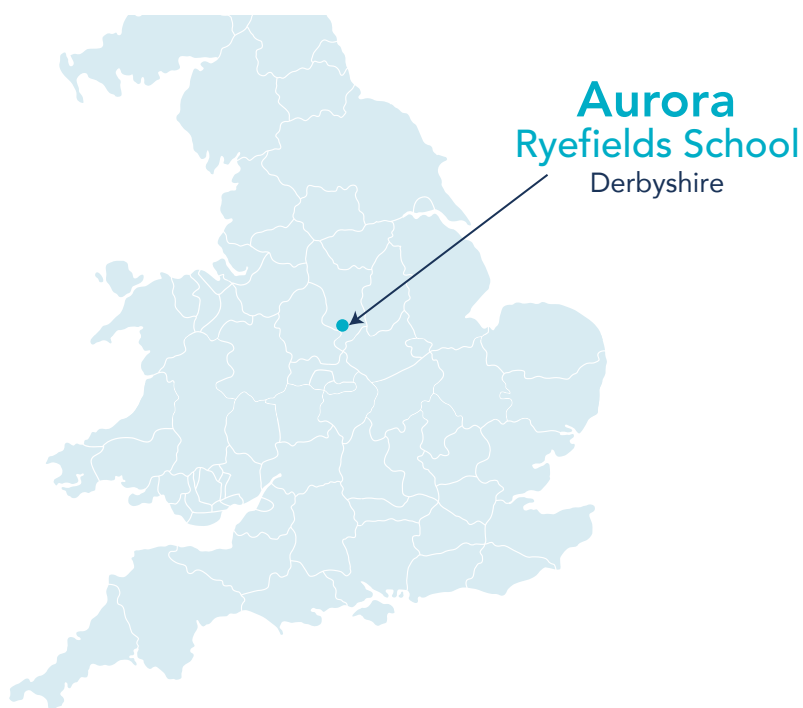
