Welcome

At Aurora Vincent House School, we provide a nurturing and inclusive environment designed specifically for autistic and neurodivergent learners. Many of our students experience high levels of anxiety, which can affect various aspects of their lives. We are committed to creating a calm, safe and supportive space where every young person can learn, and where safeguarding is always our priority.

Our approach is simple and effective. We focus on relationships, prioritising the health and wellbeing of our young people and creating an environment where students feel safe and regulated. In all aspects of our practice, we strive to be both neuro-informed and neuro-affirmative. We are here to empower our young people to successfully navigate a world that is biased toward the neurotypical without changing their identity.

Therapeutic approaches are intrinsic to our educational provision as we believe in offering a holistic curriculum. We are committed to a 'preparation for life' curriculum, providing students with the strategies they need not only now but also for later in life, so that they can be independent and lead happy lives.

We are a student-centred community where the voices of our young people and their families are not only heard but actively shape our practice. We collaborate closely with families, professionals and the wider community.

Our school systems provide the structure, routine and consistency that help students to feel safe and therefore regulated. Equally, we have the flexibility to adapt quickly when students may need a different approach or activity.

About our school

Whilst we are registered to support learners aged 5 to 19, our school is currently a provision for students aged 11 to 16 (Years 7 to 11). We offer many of the subjects that a mainstream secondary does but our delivery accounts for the needs of our neurodivergent young people.

Our approach to learning begins with an environment that gives safety and opportunities for students to be able to emotionally regulate. We look to give students intrinsic motivation for their studies and utilise their special interests to engage in school. Students are given agency within our school systems.



Our facilities

Aurora Vincent House School is situated in the heart of Horsham, West Sussex. The buildings have undergone extensive renovations and now consist of a single structure with ground and first-floor levels, along with an additional classroom on a second level. The school successfully combines a warm and friendly atmosphere with an organised environment, minimising excessive sensory stimulation. Each room is designed to allow students to self-regulate and express their individuality, offering a selection of tables and chairs that cater to their sensory needs. The facilities are particularly supportive for students who find it challenging to thrive in mainstream settings.





Facilities include:

- **Extensive Sports Provision:** Multi Use Games Area for netball, tennis, basketball, football, and street hockey; access to gym, swimming, and local leisure facilities.
- **Therapeutic Physical Activity:** range of regulation options including indoor rower, cycle machine, mindfulness, and a sensory room.
- **Specialist Classrooms:** fully equipped Science lab (GCSE level), Food Technology room plus dedicated Art and Horticulture spaces.
- **Creative and Practical Learning:** access to cooking sessions; students help plan and prepare meals tailored to individual dietary needs.
- **Technology for Learning:** all students use laptops, with iPads available as needed.
- **Outdoor & Adventurous Experiences:** regular visits to parks and nature areas, outdoor trips, residentials, and activities such as go-karting.
- **Community & Collaboration:** events with other SEND schools, family days, and after-school clubs.
- **Therapeutic Support:** onsite OT, SALT, and Clinical Psychology input; regulation through interaction with a school therapy dog and visits to farms and animals, with equine therapy in development.
- **Commitment to Swimming:** all students swim regularly with a goal of proficiency by Year 11.



Our curriculum

The curriculum at Aurora Vincent House School is built around the individual's learning needs and personal goals. We are a neuro-informed and neuro-affirmative school, supporting our young people to understand their own unique neurology and way of being in the world, and to understand their support needs. Our students each have their own bespoke route through KS3 and KS4 to provide them with the best possible combination of holistic and academic opportunities. We offer a rich and varied curriculum that aims to prepare them for an independent and fulfilling adult life. We hold high aspirations for all our students and aspire to them achieving a form of formal accreditation that will support them in taking their next steps in education.

Our core curriculum includes the opportunity to access GCSE courses and accreditation in a variety of subjects, alongside Entry Level and alternative qualifications to support students who demonstrate their skills outside of traditional examinations. The student-centred curriculum has the flexibility to increase time spent on a particular subject or activity that increases their overall engagement in school and helps regulate and improve their wellbeing. For example, some may have additional art sessions or be involved in a specific media project.

We provide an integrated therapeutic approach, reducing any divide between 'therapy' and 'education' as far as is possible and ensuring that the lessons and approaches we use have therapeutic and supportive practices built into the fabric of teaching and learning throughout the curriculum. We have a team of therapists, including a clinical psychologist, as part of our core staff who work directly with staff to create a truly therapeutic educational experience.

We have a high staff-to-student ratio, and classes are small and personal. Above everything else, we get to know our students and work with their strengths and areas of development as part of a truly inclusive and diverse school community.

The Aurora Curriculum Framework

Aurora values drive everything we do and give us a framework which informs our curriculum (what we teach our children and young people) and provide us with an overarching intent and aim. This helps us understand the impact our teaching has by providing clear and aspirational targets.

The Aurora Curriculum Framework unites us all whilst providing freedom to develop bespoke, ambitious and tailored curriculum models and learning pathways for our students.

We recognise that:

- All students should have access to a broad and balanced curriculum which engages and challenges them.
- All students need to work at a level which is appropriate to their understanding, relevant to their chronological age and at a rate that suits their individual abilities.
- Teaching is approached with the focus on the individual needs of the student.
- Each student should have a tailored curriculum based upon their baseline assessment, previous academic outcomes, long-term learning targets and life aspirations.

Your experience with us

Every young person is treated as an individual. All staff get to know each student in order to give a safe and supportive community. Helping students to understand neurodiversity and their own diagnosis permeates all aspects of our offer. We look to have a balanced approach of understanding and accepting the needs of each student whilst offering appropriate challenges and opportunities to develop.

You will see that from the outset, Aurora Vincent House School involves families in all aspects of decision-making. For example, they were responsible for choosing the logo and the uniform. Families have given us accounts of their lived experiences, which we use to guide our practice and incorporate into our staff training. There are always opportunities to vote on upcoming decisions, and we aim to be transparent and open at all times.

We pride ourselves on establishing meaningful relationships with students and their families based on trust. Whilst each student will have a class tutor and Teaching Assistants, who they tend to work more closely with, all our staff have a pastoral responsibility for the young people we have in our care. We encourage families to interact with all staff in the school. Our therapy team is onsite and will support the student within school but just as importantly, are able to offer advice and support to parents and carers too.

Aurora Vincent House School gives students who have been out of school, or unable to proceed with mainstream education, a place for them to thrive. It allows them to engage again in their learning with reduced anxiety. Their learning is meaningful and fun.

Students' outcomes will continue to be monitored long after they have left us so that we continue to be a source of support and so that we can be evidence-based in our practice – ensuring an outstanding offer to our young people so that they not only thrive now but in the future too.

Therapeutic Support

We have a multidisciplinary team who deliver specialist on-site therapy, including Occupational, Speech and Language and Psychology. The therapists work both directly with our students and indirectly through class teams and support staff to meet individual needs and can provide both one-to-one and group sessions. The therapy team are involved with all areas of each student's journey through Aurora Vincent House School.

All staff reinforce the students' therapeutic goals. There is clear communication between school and families to support consistency and understanding of approaches. Our academic and pastoral practice is all underpinned by the individual needs of the student which the therapy team are integral to identifying and supporting.

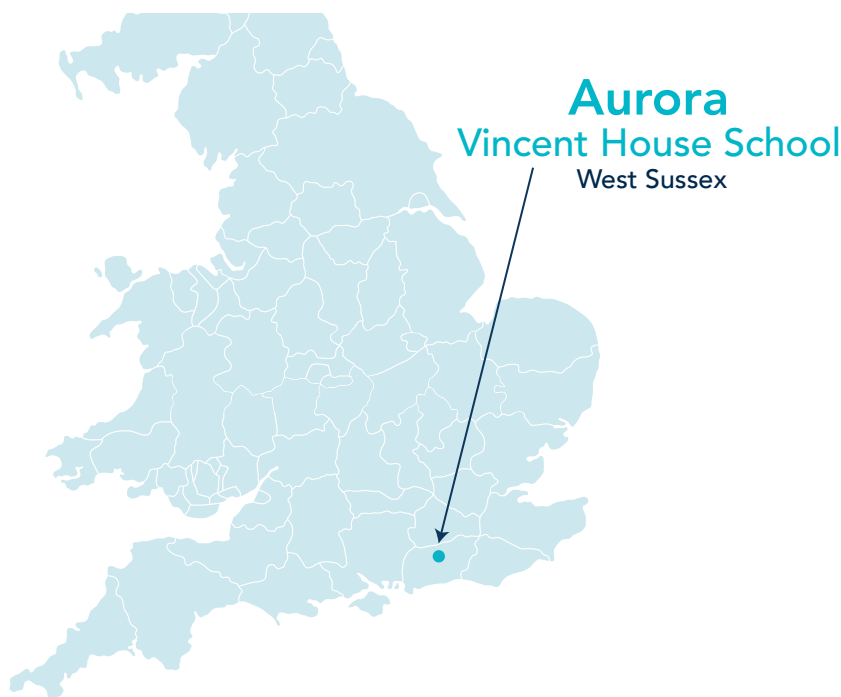
