About our school

Aurora Hanley School is an independent specialist school for young people aged 6 to 19, who may face difficulties as a result of complex communication needs typically associated with Autism spectrum conditions.

Many of our students have sensory issues and high levels of anxiety that affect their ability to cope in mainstream settings, creating difficulties that can impact negatively on their emotional wellbeing, behaviour and ability to participate fully in education.

At Aurora Hanley School, we help every young person to re-engage with learning and enjoy school life. With specialist teaching and integrated therapeutic support, small classes and a nurturing approach, we give students a framework for breaking down barriers to learning.



Our facilities

Aurora Hanley School is located near the heart of Stoke-on-Trent, in the residential area of Bucknall. The school site consists of a new two story building and four separate buildings supporting primary, nurture and administration. All our rooms are bright, modern and sensitively designed for children and young people who struggle in larger mainstream environments.

Education at Aurora Hanley School extends into the local community and city, giving young people opportunities to learn practical skills in everyday environments whenever they are ready.

Facilities include:

- Specialist classrooms for ICT, Science, Woodwork, Art and Cooking.
- Quiet reading areas and regulation stations.
- Clinical and therapeutic integrated working.
- Pupil horticulture areas.
- Outdoor Gym and Playground spaces.





Our curriculum

Aurora Hanley School offers a broad, balanced curriculum with a flexible timetable designed around each student, recognising their individual abilities, interests and needs.

Learning programmes for each Key Stage are based on the National Curriculum, with opportunities to develop functional and independent 'skills for life' offered alongside academic subjects.

All activities are based on personalised goals to ensure they are engaging, meaningful and achievable for everyone. Students are encouraged to be actively involved in school life, by making choices, contributing to their own programmes and sharing ideas regularly.

The Aurora Curriculum Framework

Aurora values drive everything we do and give us a framework which informs our curriculum (what we teach our children and young people) and provide us with an overarching intent and aim. This helps us understand the impact our teaching has by providing clear and aspirational targets.

The Aurora Curriculum Framework unites us all whilst providing freedom to develop bespoke, ambitious and tailored curriculum models and learning pathways for our students.

We recognise that:

- All students should have access to a broad and balanced curriculum which engages and challenges them.
- All students need to work at a level which is appropriate to their understanding, relevant to their chronological age and at a rate that suits their individual abilities.
- Teaching is approached with the focus on the individual needs of the student.
- Each student should have a tailored curriculum based upon their baseline assessment, previous academic outcomes, long-term learning targets and life aspirations.

Case study

Life before Hanley School

Student A is diagnosed with ASC and Anxiety. He attended a mainstream high school with over 1,500 pupils where he was put on a reduced timetable in Year 7. He struggled with his attendance due to the large size of the school, crowds, and noise.

Moving to Hanley School

Student A started his journey with Aurora Hanley School in March 2020 and left in July 2023 to attend college.

At Aurora Hanley School, he had access to timetabled weekly mind-work sessions delivered by the clinical team, which specifically focused on diagnosis awareness, emotional management, self-esteem and mindfulness. He also had access to weekly Speech and Language sessions and 1:1 sessions around his anxieties, sleep, school attendance & future. By July 2023, Student A achieved the following qualifications:

- Maths Functional Skills Level 1 - Pass
- English Functional Skills Level 1 - Pass
- English Functional Skills Level 2 - Pass
- BTEC Home Cooking Skills Level 2 - Pass
- Art, Craft and Design GCSE - Grade 2
- Foundation Mathematics IGCSE - Grade 3
- Science Entry level 2 certificate - Entry 2
- Prince's Trust Entry 3 Award in Personal Development in Employability Skills - Pass





Your experience with us

Every student has a tutor and dedicated teaching assistant who offer consistent support and encouragement throughout the school day and support communication with families.

Individual student support plans (SSPs) help our students develop positive self-regulation and coping strategies, facilitating their learning and creating a positive school experience for everyone.

Our focus is on supporting each student to understand their diagnosis, build their resilience and reduce their anxiety and is supported via our Clinical Psychology teams, who work together with students and their families to explore and develop individual strengths and aspirations.

Our other therapeutic provision includes speech and language therapy and occupational therapy, with our clinical staff working in conjunction with teaching and support staff to provide holistic support for every student.

Uniform

At Aurora Hanley School we do not have a school uniform. We know that many of our students struggle with the feel and texture of clothes, so we prefer them to wear whatever makes them feel comfortable in school.

Term dates

We align our term dates yearly to those of our local authority. We also allocate five inset training days to staff. All these dates can be accessed via our school website.

Transport

All transport is via local authority-funded taxis and is not organised by the school.

School meals

We produce a weekly visual menu of our food, which is emailed to all parents and carers.

All meals are freshly prepared and cooked on site, with all produce sourced locally. Special dietary requirements can be catered for and we will always do our best to support and encourage our students to taste new textures and flavours. If any student does not feel able to eat the menu on site they are more than welcome to bring a packed lunch.
