

About our school

At Aurora Keyes Barn School, we provide personalised, specialist education for boys aged 5-12 who face challenges associated with additional social, emotional or mental health needs.

We offer a nurturing and safe environment in which each of our pupils can learn and express themselves, supported by skilled staff who understand their needs.

By giving our pupils the opportunity to be part of an enriched school and community life, we enable them to achieve their own unique level of independence as they approach adolescence, ultimately preparing them for life beyond school.



Our facilities

Aurora Keyes Barn School is situated in Salwick, a largely rural village between Kirkham and Preston in Lancashire.

The main part of the school is based in a converted barn consisting of two classes and two breakout areas. Outside we have an additional classroom as well as three multipurpose rooms alongside the main school building. The school can cater for up to 24 pupils.

All classrooms have a range of IT resources, which pupils make use of in a number of ways during their lessons and break times. Within our breakout areas we have a music space with quitars and an electronic drum set, which pupils are welcome to use.

We have three outdoor areas, including a soft area with a variety of exercise equipment for pupils to use during break times, as well as two hard court areas where pupils can ride their scooters or play ball games.

In addition to the facilities on site, our pupils have access to a range of sports and outdoor education centres within the local area.





Our curriculum

At Aurora Keyes Barn School, we provide a wealth of opportunities for our pupils to develop the skills and knowledge to get 'Life Ready'! We offer broad, balanced and needs-led learning programmes based on the National Curriculum, to which pupils are encouraged to make positive contributions. As well as furthering their academic skills this also promotes the development of important life skills, such as confidence and a sense of responsibility.

As part of our commitment to promoting physical activity at Aurora Keyes Barn School, we offer two PE sessions a week, incorporating individual sports, team games, swimming and more adventurous activities such as indoor climbing.

Our regular school assemblies offer pupils the opportunity to celebrate achievements, events and special occasions together. We share and celebrate pupils' achievements and reward pupils for their efforts in weekly prize-giving assemblies.

The Aurora Curriculum Framework

Aurora values drive everything we do and give us a framework which informs our curriculum (what we teach our children and young people) and provide us with an overarching intent and aim. This helps us understand the impact our teaching has by providing clear and aspirational targets.

The Aurora Curriculum Framework unites us all whilst providing freedom to develop bespoke, ambitious and tailored curriculum models and learning pathways for our students.

We recognise that:

- All students should have access to a broad and balanced curriculum which engages and challenges them.
- All students need to work at a level which is appropriate to their understanding, relevant to their chronological age and at a rate that suits their individual abilities.
- Teaching is approached with the focus on the individual needs of the student.
- Each student should have a tailored curriculum based upon their baseline assessment, previous academic outcomes, long-term learning targets and life aspirations.


Our small class sizes allow us to provide a focused and personalised education, with close monitoring of individual targets and behaviour to identify and avoid potential problems.


Where required, we offer enhanced support throughout the school day to facilitate access to the curriculum and participation in school activities. We also offer an inclusion policy allowing for mainstream support and the provision of 'time-out placement' each week.


Behavioural, emotional and social wellbeing of pupils are monitored throughout the week, with our onsite Clinical Psychology team working alongside our teaching staff to offer prompt and timely support to those pupils who need it.

The Clinical Psychology team's work is underpinned by attachment and trauma-informed principles and strategies, to ensure that pupils' needs are understood in the context of their life experiences.


Quality statement


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


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
