Our curriculum

Our academic and vocational study programmes are designed to help every pupil access employment, training or further education. Many of our pupils have gone on to continue their studies at local colleges such as Kingston Maurward and Aurora Boveridge College – with whom we share our beautiful campus. We offer a varied curriculum, including academic subjects such as English, maths, science, humanities and art up to GCSE level, as well as vocational subjects including animal care and motor vehicle engineering. We also offer a Bush Craft programme, delivered on-site in our extensive grounds.

During their time at Aurora Beeches School, pupils are offered access to a comprehensive careers programme with independent careers advice. The programme adheres to the Gatsby Benchmarks and includes use of the online careers programme “Unifrog” to investigate future opportunities, as well as being part of the PSHCE programme.

Success at Aurora Beeches School is about more than just academic achievement.

Our teaching staff work closely with our onsite therapy team, offering pupils access to Speech and Language Therapy and Occupational Therapy to support their long-term success and to help them develop essential independent living skills.

We follow the Zones of Regulation framework, designed to help our pupils foster self-regulation and emotional control, and all our staff receive regular training to help them understand and address the challenges associated with various mental health diagnoses.



Case study



Life before Beeches School

When Student A arrived at Beeches two years ago he was shy and introverted.

Wanting perfection, he was hard on himself when he made mistakes which meant he was slow to complete his work. He was particularly anxious around assessments and coursework.

Moving to Beeches School

Having struggled in a large mainstream school, the small classes and personal approach at Beeches really suited Student A.

He slowly grew in confidence and wasn't afraid to ask when he didn't understand. He was very welcoming to new pupils and even became a student leader.

By the time he left, Student A had gained good academic qualifications and was an invaluable member of the community. He's now studying a media production course at Poole College.

Term dates

Term dates follow those set by Dorset County Council.

School meals

School meals are provided and there is always a choice of options, with all dietary requirements catered for.

Absence

Absence is monitored closely and programmes to support attendance are negotiated with parents and pupils on an individual basis.

Uniform

There is no school uniform at Aurora Beeches, as we understand that for pupils with sensory or anxiety issues, uniform requirements can present a barrier to attendance.

We do however ask that parents remember that certain clothing may not be appropriate in a school setting, and to use their judgment accordingly.
