In total, 5 candidates were entered for between 2 and 6 exams public exams¹. This gave us 25 possible entries at GCSE Foundation Level. The highest level for Foundation is a Grade 5. 3 students were also entered for the Art Award which is accounted for in a separate table.

Resulting analysis is that all students received a GCSE Grade for every exam they were entered for. This represents 100% pass rate.

A break down of overall grades looks like the following:

16% Grade 5 - Good Pass

24% Grade 4 - Passing Grade

36% Grade 3

16% Grade 2

8% Grade 1

40 % of grades achieved are considered passing grades; that is, those that are demanded of 6th Forms and Colleges. However, all grades are recognised.

Trinity College Arts Awards results were particularly pleasing.

3 candidates were entered – 2 for the Bronze (Level 1) Arts Award and 1 for the Silver (Level 2) Arts Award. All candidates were awarded at the level they were entered for. This represents a 100% pass rate. In addition, Arts Award Silver, Level 2 is the equivalent of a Grade 5 at GCSE
